Much was achieved at the recent IFLA World Council meeting in Montreal, Canada and we will be sharing news of proceedings over the coming months. One key outcome was the formal adoption of two ICOMOS-IFLA Documents.

The [ICOMOS-IFLA Document on Historic Urban Public Parks](#) recognises historic urban public parks are an essential and inalienable part of the traditions and plans of many towns and settlements and the need from them to be preserved as historic sites for the use and enjoyment of present and future generations.

Secondly the [ICOMOS IFLA Principles Concerning Rural Landscapes as Heritage](#) were adopted. Recognising rural landscapes as a vital component of the heritage of humanity - and one of the most common types of continuing cultural landscapes - the document encourages deep reflection and offers guidance on the ethics, culture, environmental, and sustainable transformation of rural landscape systems, at all scales, and from international to local administrative levels.

Steve Brown, President ICOMOS/IFLA International Scientific Committee on Cultural Landscapes (ISCCL) declared this 'brilliant news' and stated 'I heartily thank Kathryn Moore (IFLA President) for making this happen and Diane Menzies (New Zealand) for sharing the great news'.

Additionally IFLA World Council conferred Honorary Membership of IFLA to Francesco Bandarin and Mechtild Rossler (UNESCO World Heritage Centre) and ISCCL members Hal Moggridge (UK) and Hans Dorn (Germany) for their substantial contributions to cultural landscapes. Both Hal and Hans were present to receive the acclamation of IFLA World Council members.
