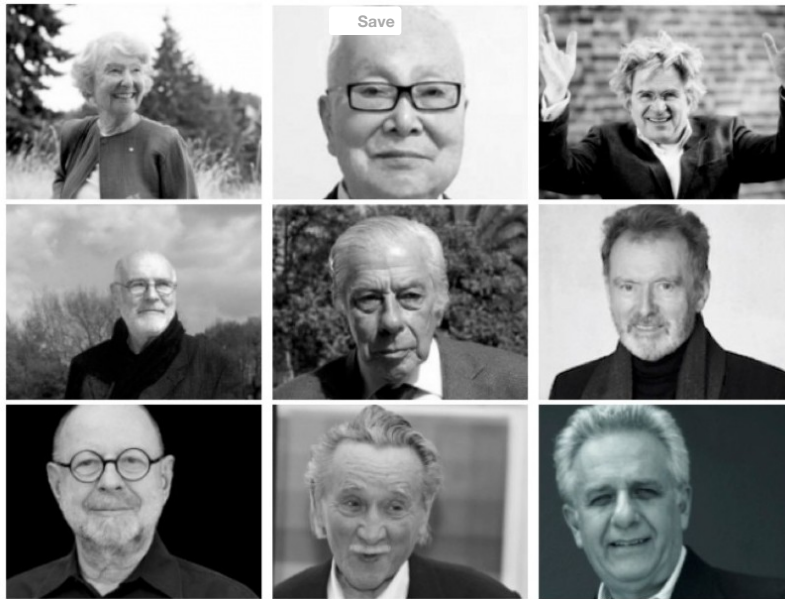


IFLA NEWS



There are under two weeks left before nominations close for the Sir Geoffrey Jellicoe awards, the highest honor that IFLA can bestow upon a landscape architect.

The Jellicoe Award recognizes a living landscape architect whose achievements and contributions have had a unique and lasting impact on the welfare of society and the environment and on the promotion of the profession of landscape architecture. The award is bestowed annually on an individual whose work and achievements merit this recognition.

The Jellicoe Award was initiated in 2004. [Previous winners include](#) Dirk Sijmons (2017), Peter Latz (2016), Mario Schjetnan (2015), Sun Xiao Xiang (2014), Gonçalo Ribeiro Telles (2013), Mihály Mőcsényi (2012), Cornelia Hahn Oberlander (2011), Bernard Lassus (2009), and Peter Walker (2005).

The annual award is open to landscape architects throughout the world. The nominee must be an academic, or practitioner, whose merit, talent, and actions are respected internationally. Accomplishments may be in landscape planning, design, or management; improvement in the quality of human settlements or environments; or landscape architectural education.
